On the Centennial Project front, Lions around the world leading through service, 215,168,451 people have been served world wide. This has surpassed the goal of 100 million people by July 2018. Within our own district we have so far served 275,965 over the past four years. That is a good number for a district with 2179 Lions members. Keep entering your activity reports so that our number can grow before July 2018. LCI wants us to continue to serve so that by 2020 we will be serving 200 million people a year.

# Canadian Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centre Report

Feb. 15/2018

Although CLERC has been experiencing Eyeglass Inventory shortages, we continue to provide solid numbers of glasses to our clients. In this quarter we processed 260,00 pairs and shipped 132,450 pairs. To date CLERC has placed 4,886,550 pairs on faces in 92 countries. We will hit 5 million pairs this year, as we will ship out the remaining 113,450 pairs. The 5 millionth pair of glasses are already selected and will be photographed going through the entire process right up to being placed on a face at a Lions Eyeglass Outreach. There will be a short window to celebrate and then we start back on processing the next million pairs.

We are happy to report that Lion Jack Busst from the Southridge Lions has joined our Board of Directors. Jack was our CLERC Volunteer of the year last year.

CLERC continues to promote Lions Eyeglass Recycling in a number of ways. We post articles on both the CLERC Facebook page, Our Website and also on the Lions of Canada Facebook page. We posted a call out for the need to replenish our eyeglass inventory on the Lions of Canada Website. That post had over 170 shares to various Lions Clubs across the country. Slowly but surely the glasses are starting to arrive from places that we haven't ever received them from, or locations that haven't sent them in a long time. Please continue to have Lions clubs send us glasses as WE REALLY NEED GLASSES to replenish the inventory. Box Location, Lions Pick up Contacts and store contacts are also important information to send us at [www.clerc.ca](http://www.clerc.ca) as we need that for our data base. This information can also be sent directly to CLERC Vice Chair Darryl Axenty at [daxenty@shaw.ca](mailto:daxenty@shaw.ca), as this is part of his portfolio of duties. ## As part of Lions Club International Week of Service to Fight

**Hunger**, the Rimbey Lions partnered with Evergreen Co-op to hold a "Restock The Shelves" event for the Rimbey Food Bank. Over a two day period, Lions collected 1357 lbs of food and \$1200.00 in cash donations to help the Food Bank continue their service to residents of Rimbey and area.

Locally in Calgary, we are promoting Lions/Leos and CLERC by offering 1/2 day sessions where we have Grade 8 students from Menno Simons School, Heritage Academy and Calgary Christian Academy are being taught the process and hopefully welcomed in to our World of Service. We continue to have Grade 12 students from Notre Dame come in and process glasses, as well as Young Offenders that get Community Service sentences.

We applied to the courts for this opportunity, and the volunteers come with a Supervisor to process glasses. CLERC will be attending the MDC in Leduc in May and have been asked to do a participatory workshop. Details to follow, as it remains a discussion at this point.

CLERC has had an awful time with theft and break ins. Our 3 ton truck has been broken into twice with over \$300 worth of tools stolen, the gas filler tube punched out of it and

the gas siphoned off at least twice. We will have spent almost \$2000.00 repairing it. The Tommy Gate (rear pallet lift) control was also stolen. Also 25 plastic totes of glasses that were sorted, sanitized, hand dried and ready to be read, have been stolen. What ever the thieves will do with them is unimaginable. Our 20' Sea Can at the CNIB has been broken into by homeless individuals and glasses were also stolen. There was an arrest and it will go before the courts.....LOL hopefully Judge Brian Stevenson will hear the case! We have installed cameras indoors and out, but these are professional thieves who wear hoodies and never expose their faces or their vehicles.

The CLERC Executive is brainstorming to find new ways to promote the Eyeglass program. Our next Cabinet meeting is Feb. 21, and our AGM is June 23 at the CLERC Warehouse. Details to follow.



Many thanks to Council and to the CLERC Executive for their dedication and perseverance. Special thanks to Secretary Gordon Prusky who keeps all the stats, works tirelessly, Darryl Rawleigh who does so much for all aspects of the program, and Myrna McMullen our competent Treasurer. Darryl and Denise Axenty are invaluable in keeping our eyeglass sorting process organized. HUGE THANKS to ALL Lions Clubs for your willingness to Volunteer and financially support CLERC. You are the backbone of this Canadian Lions Initiative.

## Vision Mission, Mexico 2018

Lions from Oregon and Alberta are planning to head to Mexico in November, 2018 to again distribute those eyeglasses that Lions Clubs collect year round. This year is the 16<sup>th</sup> year that this mission is operating. Organized by the Oak Bottom Lions from Portland, OR, specifically headed up by PDG Lion Sharon Elder, this years' trip (Oct 31-Nov 10) will see approximately 40 Lions, friends and family, work a five-day clinic to assess and distribute 2500 pairs of glasses to Mexicans in Los Varas, Nayarit, MX.

The glasses (we will take 8000 pairs from a Lions warehouse) were collected by volunteers, cleaned and stored by prescription number and will be boxed and transported along with supplies for assessing high blood pressure and diabetes, and even white canes to share with the clinic attenders.

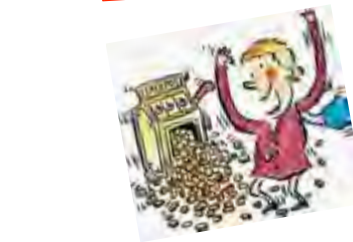

We hope that all Lions Clubs have had a great Centennial celebration during Canada 150. In the past we have had the support of all our valuable Lions clubs in Western Canada. Without the support of Lions Clubs, what we do would not be possible. In 2017, we hosted the Western Canadian Blind Golf Open Championships in Warman, Saskatchewan. We had 42 total participants and the event was a success.

In 2018, blind golf will be in full swing again!!! The Western Canadian Championships will be hosted in Winnipeg, Manitoba July 9<sup>th</sup>-July 11<sup>th</sup>. August 16<sup>th</sup>-August 17<sup>th</sup>, Truro, Nova Scotia will be the host of the Canadian Championships. At Blind Golf Canada, it is our mission to develop and promote blind golf along with true sportsmanship among Canada's blind and partially-sighted golfers wishing to play at a national and/or international level.

For those of you who don't know, blind golf is played by golfers who are totally blind or partially sighted (with an acuity of 20/200 or less). The rules are the same; the only difference being that blind golfers may ground their club in a hazard. We use the aid of a sighted guide and its game on!



Canada is a member country within the International Blind Golf Association, and along with thirteen other member and five associate-member countries, we host and partake in tournaments held in Canada and around the world! Our own Canadian Open Blind Golf Championship has been hosted since 1997, is an annual event and is always a prominent stop on the IBGA tour. Canada has hosted two of the most successful World Championship events held to date; Winnipeg in 2002 and in Truro, Nova Scotia in 2012!

We would like to welcome you to Blind Golf Canada! Our motto is You Can Still Play! It is our hope that as someone who is blind or partially-sighted, you will come out and join us. If you are a sighted individual, get involved as a guide or a score keeper at a tournament in your local area, or just come out and watch us! You will be amazed!
