Lions Club of Leduc's Fourth annual shred event. The event is free to all individuals and small businesses for a chance to get rid of old and unwanted paper products they want to dispose of. Iron Mountain provides a truck and driver for a nominal fee and the Lions provide free hot-dogs, pop and water provided by Safeway (we use their parking lot.) We ask people to provide a donation to the Food Bank in exchange for shredding or people can just drop by make a donation and we give them a hot dog. This event runs from 10 am to 2 pm, usually on the Saturday of the Father's Day weekend. This year we received cash donations of \$887 as well as 388kg of food which the Food Bank equates to \$1009.

Each Saturday and Sunday during the month of May, the Rimbey Lions Club held their annual "2 Hours In May" community service project. Lions members along with community volunteers would spend 2 hours (or more) each weekend, sprucing up the community. This year's projects included painting 5 picnic tables, 2 garbage barrels, 1 teeter totter, and the metal perimeter posts around Lions Park and the Skateboard Park. Sixteen park benches were sanded and painted on main street and tin installed on two soccer sheds. We repaired the chain link fence by the Ag grounds entrance, and installed new Canadian flags at Paskapoo Park and the campground. We painted the tops of the garbage bins at the campground showers, and picked garbage around town. 32 volunteers put in 84 hours of service. We serve our community..... and get our hands dirty too!
