The food bank services the Sturgeon County areas of Bon Accord, Gibbons, Legal and Namao. This facility co-located with the Gibbons Family Resource Centre is responsible for distribution of food products to families in need in their designated area. The food bank currently employs 29 volunteers who generously donate their time to receive, separate and prepare food deliveries to go out to approximately 16 families on a weekly basis. Director Georgina Melnyk is very enthusiastic about

the program this facility provides to the needy families they support and she has been committed to helping out for 15 years. She says that this is the busiest time of year for the food bank as they get a lot of donations from various organizations, and schools. It is also the time of greatest needs for families and this donation will go a long way to providing necessities. The Legal Lions Club holds meat draws every Saturday and have raised funds to help out the less fortunate. They are also collecting lightly used clothing, blankets and toiletries that will be donated to the Gibbons Family Resource Centre to be handed out to local residents along with the food hampers. Donations can be dropped off at Club 60 Roses every Wed evening from 7-9 PM. The Lions motto is "WE SERVE"


