leadership Forum in Spokane in September. I will be taking April 15 to 22 off for "me" time with my family.





From Handheld OCT to Ultrawide Imaging Camera: A New Initiative for the Lions Eye Research Foundation

Originally, the Lions Eye Research Foundation (LERF) was interested in bringing an OCT to the Eye Institute of Alberta at the Royal Alexandra Hospital in Edmonton. OCT - Optical Coherence Tomography - is an advancement in diagnostic imaging that makes non-invasive, non-contact eye scans possible. With the help of LERF, the Eye Institute was looking forward to purchasing a model called ENVISU C2300 by the German company Leica. This model is the world's only handheld, FDA-cleared (Food and Drug Administration - USA) OCT

system that supports the diagnosis of eye diseases. More specifically, like no other OCT system, ENVISU C2300 captures high-resolution, high-density images, and therefore has diagnostic capabilities that were not possible before. Unfortunately, Leica did not renew its registration with Health Canada for ENVISU C2300. Consequently, the Eye Institute was no longer able to proceed with the purchase of this equipment.

Leica's handheld OCT is uncontested, and patients could have greatly benefitted from having such a device at the Royal Alexandra Hospital. Instead of purchasing an alternative, Dr. Karim Damji – head of the Eye Institute – identified and introduced another top priority need: the CLARUS camera system and its corresponding software from Zeiss. This ultrawide imaging camera takes exceptionally detailed photos of the retina, allowing clinicians to more

easily detect tumors, retinal tears, infections, and vascular diseases of the eye. The Zeiss camera is the latest technology, and it is especially valuable for treating patients with eye cancer. The cost of the ultrawide imaging camera and its software is approximately \$150,000, which is similar to the cost of the Leica OCT device. Dr. Damji's hope is that the Lions Club would support the purchase of the Zeiss camera since the OCT is no longer an option. Having this ultrawide imaging camera at the Royal Alexandra Hospital would enable the Eye Institute to continue to grow as a medical centre of excellence in Alberta. Most importantly, it would tremendously improve the clinical care of patients who struggle with difficult diseases of the eye.

Lions Foundation of Canada – Election of Alberta/Northwest Territories Director (at the MD C Convention, April 26, 2019)

Responsibilities and Qualifications

1. Responsibilities:

Promote in cooperation with the District Chairpersons of MD C the need for the service being provided and the status of the Lions Foundation of Canada.

Convey the need for contributions from the Lions clubs of MD C to support the programs that the Foundation offers

Report to Council as to changes in personnel or any action that affects the status of the Foundation;

the voting delegates attending the MD C Convention held during the final year of the incumbent's term shall elect the nominee for the position of Alberta Director by a secret ballot. This election shall be for a three(3) year term. The Director so elected shall also serve as the MD C Lions Foundation of Canada Chairperson. The MD C office shall publish in the last two(2) issues of the MD C newsletter of any calendar year preceding such an election, a notice seeking candidates for this position from the Lions of MD C in Canada. This notice shall also contain a list of qualifications for the position.

Any qualified Lion wishing to be a candidate for this position shall file a letter of intent, a biography and a copy of their Lions Club endorsement with the MD C office (Betty Ann Robson mdccouncilsecretary@gmail.com) before April 1 of the year of the election.

2. Qualifications:

To qualify for the office of an Elected Director on the Board of Directors, a candidate must be:

- (a) A Lion in good standing;
- (b) A person who is not an employee of the Lions Foundation of Canada; and,
- (c) A person who has done any one of the following:
 - (i) Served as a District chairperson for LFC as appointed by the elected Director;
 - (ii) Served as a District chairperson for LFC as appointed by the District Governor;
 - (iii) Served as the Multiple District chairperson for LFC as appointed by the Council Chairperson;
 - (iv) Served as District Governor, and has participated in the Lions Foundation of Canada orientation program;
 - (v) Served as a Representative, appointed by the Lions Foundation of Canada, promoting and supporting one of the Foundations projects.

Lions Foundation of Canada Alberta Director Duties/Responsibilities

- 1. Attend Board of Director(BOD) meetings(3) at Oakville, Ontario in February, June and October each year of your term.
 - a. February BOD meeting regular meeting.
 - b. June BOD meeting regular meeting, District Governor elect Orientation weekend. Memorial Forest service on Saturday. Spouse can also attend up to \$500 flight cost covered. Wednesday evening Feast bring food representing your province. Business attire required for Friday night banquet. At the Memorial service you will be required to read out the names of people from your province who have had a tree dedicated in the service LFC will provide the list. Dress is Director shirt and black pants for the Memorial Service.
 - c. October BOD meeting regular meeting, meet new BOD's and vote on new chairperson. Business dress required for group photo. Annual General Meeting is held at this meeting.
- 2. Liaison with Alberta District Chairpersons. Ensure they are receiving information from the Foundation and distributing it to the Zone Chairpersons or directly to the clubs.
 - a. Send out a congratulatory note to each of the District Chairpersons.
 - b. Let them know you are available with any questions or help they may need to make their year a success.
 - c. Send out the 1/4ly results to each District chair so they know which clubs are participating. These are received from LFC.

- 3. Send out a congratulatory email to all clubs that participated in the Pet Valu Walk for Dogguides (usually have the information by August/September.)
- 4. Read the Bylaws as provided to you at the October meeting so you have a full understanding of the Foundation and how it works.
- 5. You will be appointed to one or more committees which may or may not require the occasional conference call.
- 6. Attend the two District Conventions of C-1 and C-2.
 - a. Reserve a display table prior to the event date (2 months early).
 - b. Ask District Convention Chair to present at LFC at the business portion.
 - c. Set up the display table at the Conference with pamphlets and merchandise items for sale.
 - d. You or the District rep need to be at the display table Friday evening and all day Saturday, except when presenting and at lunch.
- 7. Attend the Multiple District Convention in May.
- 8. You are the MD-C LFC Chairperson. You are required to present a written report at each Council meeting. Send in a report but not necessary to be at the meeting. If you can attend, ask to give your report verbally as well as written.
- 9. You are also required to prepare a written report one month prior to each BOD meeting which you will also give verbally at the meeting.
- 10. Two Director shirts are required (one is paid by LFC) and most Directors have a vest as well as this is the uniform for meetings. Nice to have two shirts as the meetings are over two days as well as the Conferences. The June meeting has several events that we are in Director shirts.
- 11. Expenses LFC will cover basic expenses for your trips to Oakville and the Conferences.
 - a. For the BOD meetings, LFC will cover your airport parking, mileage, flight, transfers to Oakville, accommodation and meals (except in transit).
 - b. For the Conventions, LFC will cover mileage, one night accommodation at the Conferences and registration.
 - c. The mileage rate is 30 cents per kilometer.
 - d. LFC will supply an expense form.
 - e. If the mileage reimbursement is high we usually request an Income Tax receipt for a portion.
- 12. You are required to have FUN during your term as Director and always remember to promote the programs of Dogguides Canada!
