News From the Lions Eye Research fund: Next Target

A Brief Introduction to the Ultra-wide Imaging Camera from Zeiss, CLARUS 500



CLARUS 500, the ultra-wide imaging camera from Zeiss, is the first fundus imaging system that provides an ultra-wide, extremely detailed image of the retina in true colour.

An ultra-wide imaging camera will take one single image, and it will capture 133 degrees of the retina. If clinicians want to capture the same field of view without an ultra-wide imaging camera, then they have to take 7 individual pictures and put them together. This procedure takes time, and the images are not as precise as they could be.

CLARUS 500 from Zeiss provides, like other ultra-wide imaging cameras, an expanded view of patients' retina in one shot. However, CLARUS 500 is also the first of its kind that takes extremely clear, sharp, high-resolution pictures in true colour. This technological advancement enables clinicians to detect subtle changes of the retina, which increases patients' chances of recovery.

While CLARUS 500 ensures high-quality images, it also creates a comfortable experience for patients. This camera has a chin rest, allowing clients to easily maintain a stable, neutral position as it takes pictures of each of their eyes. Most importantly, patients do not require dilation, a process that includes putting drops into patients' eyes to get a better view of the back of their eyes. This camera takes exceptionally detailed photos without causing stress or discomfort. Indeed, CLARUS 500 is among the best ultra-wide imaging cameras currently available, and Dr. Damji – head of the Eye Institute – hopes that the Lions Club would support the purchase of this piece of equipment. According to him, it is a camera that would allow clinicians to save people's vision at the Royal Alexandra Hospital on a regular basis.
