DG Terry's Notes:

Greetings Fellow Lions! We are now two months into this Lions year, and I am hearing wonderful things from clubs all over the District as we really move into our active time.

I had planned a very different message for you this month, but events have overtaken me. In Milan, many Lions had their phones and devices hacked. The hackers tried to scam people in their contact lists by asking them to buy gift cards or send money urgently, while pretending to be the Lion whose phone had been hacked. In the last couple of weeks, we have had several incidents of a similar type in our District.

So, I want to ensure that everyone exercises caution. We are Lions. We want to help. We want to believe that the messages we get are real. Unfortunately, this is not so. Using myself as an example: if you should ever get a message from me asking



you to send money by electronic transfer or any other way to either myself or to some other person whom you may or may not know, please do not do it, even if you and I are best friends! I would never make a request like this of anyone. If by chance I needed something like this done, I would either do it myself or call you personally to make the request. Nor would any other Lion whose phone or email

address was hacked ask anyone to do something like this. These are scams designed to prey on people who work hard for their money and they rely on the fact that most people are very nice and want to be helpful to their friends and colleagues We believe that our phones, emails, computers and so forth are secure. Unfortunately, this is not so. As your District Governor, & as a fellow Lion and, I hope, as your $\overline{\underline{Q}}$ friend, I am asking one thing of you: $^{\circ}_{\Phi}$ Trust but verify. If by chance you $\frac{\overline{0}}{c}$ get a request like this, do not do as asked. Contact the person who allegedly sent you the request. Talk to them. Do not just reply to the g email as often these people have it a set up to go back to them so they § can continue to pretend to be 5 whoever they hacked. Again, talk $\frac{\circ}{\circ}$ to the person. Make sure they did \(\xi \) send the original email. And if you cannot talk to them....do not send money. Assume the worst.

District Directory

The District C-1 Directory will no longer be published, due to privacy concerns. Distribution of the directory cannot be controlled or limited, as there are no access 5 controls in place. Already this year $\frac{1}{6}$ 3 there have been several instances of C-1 Lions' email accounts being $\frac{0}{2}$ hacked and abused - as in phishing and other criminal or abusive & activities. The principles of Freedom 2 of Information and Privacy (already in place in the European Union and elsewhere) are increasingly being applied in Canada, meaning that we would require express 5 written consent to publish personal $\frac{7}{5}$ information.

Our best workaround is to advise place Lions to use MyLCI to find the Lions they are trying to contact:

- . MyLCI has information (address, blue) 6. phone numbers, email address-to es) on every Lion, based on the information supplied by Club, blue District and Multiple District sectories.
- 2. This information is only accessible to qualified Lions: Club presidents, secretaries, and treasurers, as well as District, Multiple District, Lions Clubs International

officers and staff, and Lions assigned or appointed to specific positions (those mandated by LCI). Other appointees may be given access as guests (by District Governors and Council Chairs)

- . The information accessible is limited. For example, a District GLT can access the membership of the District, while the Multiple District GLT can access the membership of the entire Multiple District.
- MyLCI is both username and password protected and is as secure as any website on the Internet.
- Information on District Club meeting times and places can be found on the District C-1 map (See page 6). Note that Club contacts are not listed.
- The District takes your privacy seriously and does not release Lions' information without your permission. Note that when you submit promotional materials such as posters you implicitly give us permission to publish the names, phone numbers, and email addresses mentioned in such materials.

Journey of Peace

Sponsor a Lions International Peace Poster Contest and join clubs worldwide in sharing children's visions of peace with your community.

How the Contest Works

Only a Lions club can sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2019. Participating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "Journey of Peace."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Headquarters for the final judging. Entries are judged at all levels on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of theme.

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prizeKits are available January 15 – October 1, 2019. winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

Awards

Artists of posters advancing to the final international judging are recognized as follows:

- International Grand Prize Winner receives a trip to an award ceremony where he/she will receive a cash award of US\$5,000 (or local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one being the winner's parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony.
- 23 Merit Award Winners each receive a cash award of US\$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.

How to Enter

Lions clubs must order a Peace Poster Contest kit from the District C1 Peace Poster Chairperson PDG Claude Carignan. Kit costs CDN \$ 15.00. Each kit contains everything your club needs to sponsor one* school or organized, sponsored youth group:

- Official Club Contest Guide & Rules
- Official School or Youth Group Contest Guide & Rules
- Participant Flyer may be duplicated and given to each participating student to take home
- · Sticker to place on back of winning poster
- Certificates for contest winner and school or youth group

*Clubs can sponsor more than one contest in either the same or multiple school(s) and/or youth group(s) by purchasing more than one kit. Clubs will send one poster per each contest sponsored to the next level of judging.

The Lions International Essay Contest entry form is also included in this kit and on the LCI website.




