Due to the uncertainty of border restrictions, the Executive Committee approved extending the current registration fee of \$320 until August 15.

After that date, the registration fee increases to \$345, but more importantly, you are not guaranteed to be able get a hotel





34TH ANNUAL LIONS INTERNATIONAL PEACE POSTER CONTEST 2021 - 2022



"We Are All Connected"

Sponsor a Lions International Peace Poster Contest and join clubs worldwide in sharing children's visions of peace with your community.

How the Contest Works

Only a Lions club can sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2021. Darticipating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "We Are All Connected."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judying. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Meadquarters for the final judying. Entries are judged at all levels eneriginality, artistic merit and pertrayal of theme.

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winners are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

Awards

Artists of nesters advancing to the final international judging are recognized as follows:

- International Grand Prize Winner receives a trip to an award ceremony where he/shewill receive a cashaward of US\$5,000 (or local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one heing the winner's parent or logal guardian) and the spensoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony.
- 23 Merit Award Winners each receive a cash award of US\$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.

How to Enter

Liens clubs must ender a Beace Bester Centest kit from the Betiet Of Beace Bester Grainesen BDO Gamle Grignan. Kit costs CDN \$ 15.00. Each kit contains everything year club needs to sponsor one* school or organized, sponsored youth group:

- Official Club Contest Guide & Rules
- Official School or Youth Group Contest Guide & Rules
- Participant Flyer may be duplicated and given to each participating student to take home
- Sticker to place on back of winning poster
- Certificates for contest winner and school or youth group

*Clubs can sponsor more than one contest in either the same or multiple school(s) and/or youth group(s) by purchasing more than one kit. Clubs will send one poster per each contest sponsored to the next level of judging.



District Awards

LCIF Donations Award - LCIF Coordinator, PDG Terry Kozma

To be awarded to the club that donated the greatest per capita donations to L.C.I.F., for the Lions year July 1 to June 30. Information will be obtained from quarterly reports from International to the current District Governor.

District C-1 Convention Attendance Award

To be awarded to the club that had the largest percentage of their membership in attendance at the District C1 Convention. It will be the responsibility of the Convention Host Club to forward this information to the District Awards Chairperson before the end of November. This award will be presented at the subsequent District C-1 Convention.

PDG Robert J. (Bob) Gibb Club Membership Growth Award – Lion Vi Gibb

To be awarded at the District C-1 Convention to the Lions club with the largest net increase in members per Lion's year. A trophy will be presented to the winning club by Lion Vi Gibb and said trophy shall be held by that winning club until the next District C-1 Convention. The information as to what club had the largest net increase in membership will be obtained from the District Governor.

District C-1 Youth Activities Award – Submission deadline – September 30th

The District Governor will make the decision on the club that is to be presented with the award based upon the following criteria. To be eligible for this award, a Club must have done at least six of the following in the Lions year:

- 1. Participated in Lions Youth Exchange through their club member or members personally hosting a youth exchange student;
- 2. Provided a financial contribution to the District C-1 Youth Exchange Program or the Multiple District C Youth Exchange Program;
- 3. Sponsored youth(s) to travel on a Lions Youth Exchange or attend a Lions Youth Camp;
- 4. Participated in or financially supported Lions Quest Canada;
- 5. Participated in or financially supported at least two local youth organizations such as Scouts, Girl Guides, minor hockey, minor ball, minor soccer or other organized and recognized non-profit youth groups;
- 6. Provided financial support to the District C-1-and District 306A1 Sri Lanka Foster Child Program;
- 7. Made a financial contribution to Camp He Ho Ha;
- 8. Made a financial contribution to Camp Tamarack;
- 9. Sponsored a new LEO club in their community;
- 10. Provided funds to purchase equipment for children who have special medical needs;
- 11. Participated in the Peace Poster Contest;
- 12. Participated and/or financially supported Project Pride.

DR. LYNN G. HALL LEADERSHIP AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING LEADERSHIP IN LIONISM – Submission deadline – September 30th

This award was established in 1997 in recognition of the outstanding Leadership qualities as were displayed by the late Lion Dr. Lynn G. Hall. Lion Lynn was a member of various clubs for over 50 years and also served as District Governor 1952-53 and 1975-76. Always quick to step forward, no matter what the project, he was a leader by example. He was an active participant in many a fundraiser and a great Lion. Lion Lynn exemplified what Lions is all about. His professional life including teaching, school superintendent, school inspector, provincial director of school administration as well as serving as Mayor of Lac La Biche and Councillor of Wainwright.

AWARD CRITERIA

- 1. A Lions member in good standing with a Lions club for a minimum of 10 years,
- 2. A Lion who has demonstrated continuous leadership for a minimum of three (3) years,
- 3. A Lion whose leadership may be at the community, club, district or international level or a combination thereof.

APPLICATION CRITERIA

- 1. Application may be made by a Lions member in good standing within District C-1;
- 2. A letter is to be written which includes the following:
 - Name of award applied for
 - Name of the Lion
 - Name of the club
 - When the Lion became a member
 - Commitment to Lions based on the above criteria
 - Biography of applicant, (marital status, family, interests, etc.)

DISTRICT C-1 CITIZEN OF DISTINCTION – Submission Deadline – September 15th

Purpose

To bring recognition to a deserving citizen living within the boundaries of Lions District C-1. The program will also raise the profile of Lions Clubs International.

Who will be recognized?

The Lions District C-1 Citizen of Distinction will be selected from those persons who demonstrate a personal commitment to service. Service shall be broadly defined and may include, but not be limited to, work with youth, seniors, handicapped, the needy, support for global initiatives, or humanitarian service through governments or other agencies. *Lions are ineligible to be considered for this award.*

How will he/she be selected?

All Lions clubs within District C-1 shall be encouraged to submit a resume of a deserving individual to the selection committee. (*Clubs may wish to conduct a local program within their community*). Individuals and agencies may submit resumes for those they consider deserving of this prestigious recognition. Submissions from Lions clubs, individuals, and agencies may be made in memory of someone who is deceased. *The deadline for submissions to be received is September 15. Submissions shall be valid only for the year in which they have been submitted.*

Selection Committee

The committee shall be made up of: District C-1 Immediate Past District Governor (chair), District C-1 District Governor, a Past International Director, and the District C-1 Awards Chairperson.

What is the recognition?

Public recognition of the individual and their cause will be emphasized. A biography will be provided and the recipient will be named a Melvin Jones Fellow. Every effort should be made to have press/TV coverage. If that should not be practical, the District C-1 Public Relations chairperson shall ensure that news outlets are notified.

Funding requirements

Funds to purchase a Melvin Jones Fellowship to come from District C-1 and will be a budgeted item.

Where and when?

The presentation will be made annually at the District C-1 Convention.

MULTIPLE DISTRICT C HALL OF FAME – Submission deadline – September 30th

This is a multiple district award; nominations must be sent to the district for a vote at the district convention.

Any Lion, Lioness, Lions Club, Lioness Club, or Zone may nominate a candidate from District C1 to the Multiple District C Hall of Fame.

- 1. There is nomination fee;
- 2. There may be a maximum of one (1) candidate per district inducted into the Hall of Fame each year;
- 3. The Awards Chairperson must receive nominations at least thirty (30) days prior to the District's Annual Convention. Each individual district will hold an election to determine the successful candidate;
- 4. The award may be presented to either a Lion or Lioness, and only one recipient per district may be elected annually;
- 5. The award may be presented posthumously;
- 6. Each candidate must have fifteen (15) years of service and be two years removed from Council (if they have served as a member of the Council of Governors);
- 7. Each candidate should have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavours. The candidate should be of good moral character and have a good reputation in their community;
- 8. All sponsors will use the standard form, no others will be accepted;
- 9. The sponsors will ensure the candidate, or representative will be in attendance at the Multiple District Convention;
- 10. All successful candidates will be inducted to the Hall of Fame at the next Multiple District Convention;
- 11. A brief biography of each inductee shall be announced to the delegates attending the annual Multiple District Convention, and published in the subsequent Multiple District Newsletter.

I. Online Payment Options

In addition to paying by Credit Card, PayPal is now an option for Club Treasurers with a valid MyLCI User ID and password. Club Treasurers can visit MyLCI on the Lions Clubs International website. After logging onto MyLCI, choose <u>Club</u>, <u>Statement</u> and select PayPal or Credit/Debit Card

II. CHECK

The Association's account in Toronto is chartered to accept either US or Canadian dollar checks drawn on a Canadian Bank.

<u>CLUB PAYMENTS and other LCI payments:</u> Please clearly identify your payment (include the statement top, write the complete club name and club number on the front of the check, or send an invoice copy). Checks will be credited to the appropriate club account(s) as of the date they are received by the lockbox.

III. ACH Electronic Processing

Canada Pre-Authorize Debit FAQ's

Frequently Asked Questions:

Q: Should I expect to submit the Pre-Authorized Debit Agreement form more than once?

A: No, you only need to submit the form once, unless your banking information has changed, or your club no longer wishes to approve electronic payments.

Q: Who can process the pre-authorized debit?

A: The pre-authorized debit is processed at the LCI Office in Oak Brook after club approval is received.

Q: Must I call every time I want the ACH debit to be processed?

A: Yes, you must notify us each time you would like the debit to be processed. You may contact Accounts Receivable at accounts receivable@lionsclubs.org, or by fax 630-571-1683.

Q: Who determines the amount to be processed?

A: The Club Officers determine the amount and date to be processed. The approval must be received in writing.

Q: Will the electronic payment be issued in CAD?

A: Yes, the electronic payment will be issued in Canadian Dollars.

Q: What rate will be used for the payment?

A: The rate will be reflected on your club statement.

Q: Can clubs initiate the ACH on the Lions Website?

A: No, the approved ACH process allows us to debit the club bank accounts. The Accounts Receivable Department must initiate the payment.

Q: Can ACH payments be processed for Multiple District and District Accounts too?

A: Yes, ACH payments can be processed for club, district, and multiple district accounts.
