Greetings Lions

February is Lions Childhood Cancer Awareness Month. Are there activities or service events planned in your communities? Included is a list of service ideas.

The big news for the month of January is that District C1 is applying for a Hunger Pilot Program Grant for a maximum of \$100,000 USD.

The Bridge Healing Pilot Project will be launched very soon with both facilities to be ready for clients July, 2022. **ASAMINA KOCHI** (To try again) is a concept of bridging the gap between those experiencing homelessness being released from the Emergency Departments with no place to go, and the current homeless shelters and permanent housing. This is an innovative intervention solution with a goal of providing immediate transitional housing that will assist in facilitating integrated support across many domains in order to try and address the root causes of homelessness and improve the quality of life of those affected, with the goal of obtaining permanent housing.

The Lions commitment is to supply all the kitchen appliances as well as all refrigerators and microwaves for each unit. There are two facilities with 12 units per facility. The two twelve-unit buildings to be constructed integrate innovate and efficient technologies designed to be net zero and carbon free. This approach is not only environmentally friendly but also avoids high and continuously increasing electrical costs. With net zero the energy cost savings may make the economics sustainable in the future as there won't be an electricity cost for the operation. The annual saving is estimated to be about \$25,000 per year.

This project will also provide future volunteer opportunities for Lions as there will be a need for meal preparation, teaching the fundamentals of grocery shopping on a budget, and putting together care packages for the clients.

Thank you to the Lions Clubs of the Alberta Capital Region for stepping forward with your generous donations. To date, C1 has raised \$33,000.

Dr. Louis Francescutti will be one of our featured speakers at the C1 convention, Saturday, March 5th. His topic will be the Bridge Healing Project.

DUES ADJUSTMENT RESOLUTION

To be voted on at 2022 International Convention

The International Board of Directors voted in October 2019 to approve an international dues adjustment resolution that would be voted on at the 2020 International Convention, but it was postponed due to the cancellation of our 2020 convention and the move to a virtual convention in 2021 as we adapted to the pandemic. The new dues adjustment model will be voted on at the 2022 International Convention.

Under the proposal, international dues would be adjusted according to the following schedule:

- \$3 increase on July 1, 2023
- \$2 increase on July 1, 2024
- \$2 increase on July 1, 2025

Resolution #1:





Kelly LeBlanc had requested an Expression Swing. Not knowing what the heck that was, they did some research on this. It is a specially designed swing that features both a front and a back support so that the parent and the child face one another. This feature is something that provides a better connection between parent and child. A focused, one-onone connection, that is not available when pushing a swing from behind. It also provides something Rimbey doesn't offer. Something for recreation that can be used by both able bodied and children with disabilities ranging from physical to mental development. Kelly had requested this swing because she has an autistic child who would truly benefit from this.

Our club is excited to bring this equipment into Rimbey. Our hope is that there are many families who will benefit from the connection it

creates. We hope to have it installed this spring. The Blindman Valley Lions club have received a grant from Equs which will partially fund the Burke Konnection swing. They are holding another *Facebook fundraiser* this February to raise the additional funds needed for this project.



LEARN

- Raise club awareness about childhood cancer by holding an educational talk with a healthcare professional or public health official at your club or district meeting or related events.
- Collaborate with a local childhood cancer hospital or support home staff to learn about the needs of their patients and families. Brainstorm ways your club can address key challenges and gaps.
- · Research and develop a list of local childhood cancer organizations in your community to support future projects.
- · Identify local advocacy events related to childhood cancer and explore ways to get involved.

ACT // BEGINNER

- Identify nearby childhood cancer centers and support homes to request a wish or needs list. Conduct a drive to donate the requested items.
- Prepare healthy meals for families with children undergoing treatment. This can be done in collaboration with other community members to ensure the family receives food on a regular basis.
- Collect recyclable materials and donate the profits to a childhood cancer organization.
- Write cards full of well-wishes and share them with a local cancer center.
- Donate financial support or gift cards to identified families in need or a nearby childhood cancer center. This could cover expenses like gasoline, parking, food, medical expenses, etc.
- Make or buy new hats, caps, head scarves or blankets to donate to childhood cancer centers.
- Volunteer at a local childhood cancer organization fundraising event.
- Organize a community drive to assemble a toy library for the enjoyment of patients.
- Participate in a blood donation or bone marrow registry event to benefit cancer treatment.

ACT // INTERMEDIATE

- Collaborate with an organization that makes wigs for children with cancer to collect and donate hair.
- Provide tutoring services to children with cancer, their siblings, or adult learning opportunities for parents.
- Organize an event with a cancer support center to have family photographs taken.
- Raise awareness of childhood cancer through informational pamphlet distribution, radio public service announcements, or social media campaigns.
- Provide children's entertainment at a local hospital or treatment center for children with cancer. Entertainment can include social visits to read books and play games, hosting a seasonal party, or spending time with siblings of patients.
- Provide funding support for essential medicines and supportive services. Crucial medical needs could include chemotherapy supplies, nutritional supplements, medical equipment, essential staff, etc.
- Participate in a one-time volunteer activity at a childhood cancer camp.
- Organize a community childhood cancer awareness event such as a walk/run event or pamphlet distribution.

ACT // ADVANCED

- Familiarize yourself with the bone marrow transplant registry. If one is not established in your country, determine what would be needed to create one.
- Organize an advocacy event to impact government policy around childhood cancer.
- Acquire and equip vehicles for the transportation of patients and family members for commuting to and from the hospital.
- Volunteer at established support housing facilities or develop a new one.
- Make yarn character wigs (ex. Superhero, princess) for children with cancer.
- Organize a workshop with medical specialists in child oncology for pediatric physicians, nurses, related medical personnel, or parents to train on early diagnosis of childhood cancer.
- Organize a fun half-day retreat for families of children in remission or the siblings of children with cancer.
- Furnish waiting rooms for the families and quests of children with cancer.
- Organize and facilitate an activity at a childhood cancer camp.
- Create mini-kitchens at hospitals or support homes for food preparation and supply with food.
- Organize a fundraiser for a childhood cancer organization, or for a local family who has been impacted by childhood cancer.





PLEASE REGISTER EARLY AS SPACE IS LIMITED

For your safety the convention committee is implementing strict adherence to the provincial Restriction Exemption Program (REP), and social distancing guidelines will be followed in all sessions.

WHAT THIS MEANS FOR ATTENDEES age 12 and over.

To enter the convention hotel you must show:

- A government issued picture ID together with one of;
- a) A valid QR code proof of full vaccination or,
- b) A valid proof of medical exemption.

If you can't show **a)** or **b)** above you will not be allowed to enter the convention hotel. If you are sick – please stay home.

AND you must wear a mask at all times in all public areas of the hotel except when actively dining.
