

Established in 1983 by Lions Across Canada, LFCDG was the first school in Canada to specialize in training guide dogs for people who are blind or visually impaired. Now, LFCDG is the only service dog school in the world with seven distinct Dog Guide programs (Canine Vision, Hearing, Service, Seizure Response, Autism Assistance, Diabetes Alert, and Facility Support).

From breeding to rearing and training with a lifetime of follow-up services, each Dog Guide costs approximately \$35,000, yet is provided at no expense to eligible Canadians from coast to coast. LFCDG relies on donations to provide these special matches and does not receive any government funding.

Time to Grow to Meet Demand

With one in five Canadians 15 years of age and up living with one or more disabilities, more Canadians are seeking the services of a specialized Dog Guide. Over the next five years, LFCDG's goal is to reduce wait lists and waiting time by increasing the number of people receiving a Dog Guide.

To achieve this goal, LFCDG must build a new national Dog Guide training school.

The new school will be fully accessible and provide many improvements including a classroom and specific training area for each program.

HOW CAN A TRADITIONAL CLUB USE BRANCHES TO GROW?

- It is a Club Branch, not a Branch Club, since it is not a club but a branch in your club.
- A Club Branch is not required to ultimately charter as a club.
- 3. Club Branch Lions are full members of your club
- A club can have as many branches as it desires and can support
- Opening a Club Branch/es within your club can be used to increase your service and grow your club membership
- 6. Branches may set their own club dues
- 7. Branches will elect their own officers, and may set their own meeting times and places, choose their own service projects, raise, manage and spend their own funds, and essentially operate independently under the supervision of the Board of the parent club. This allows your club to reach out to people who may not have wanted to join your club, but will join the branch.

In 1967, the International Association of Lions Clubs board of directors adopted Leo Clubs as an official worldwide program "to provide the youth of the world an opportunity for development and contribution, individually and collectively, as responsible members of the local, national, and international community."

Since then, Leo Clubs have flourished. They are now present in over 150+ countries and have estimated membership of 160,000+ in 7,400+ clubs worldwide.

What are Leo Clubs?

- Leo Clubs are groups of young people, worldwide who provide hundreds of valuable humanitarian services for their community and around the world.

 Leos reflect the proud **We Serve** spirit of Lions Club International. Each Leo Club functions as an activity of a Lions Club.





- The District Governor must receive nominations at least 45 days prior to the District's Annual Convention.
- Each individual District will hold an election to determine the successful candidate(s).
- The award may be presented posthumously.
- Each candidate must have 15 years of service and not be a member of the current Council of Governors.
- Each candidate should have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavors. He/she should be of good moral character and have a good reputation in his/her community.
- All sponsors shall use the standard *MDC nomination form* (attached). No other application formats will be accepted.
- The sponsor(s) will ensure the candidate, or a representative, will attend the Multiple District Convention.
- All successful candidates will be inducted to the Hall of Fame at the next MDC Convention.
- The presentation of the MDC Hall of Fame Awards is the responsibility of the MDC Council Chairperson.
- A brief biography of each inductee shall be announced to the delegates attending the Annual MDC Convention, and published in the subsequent MDC Newsletter.
- The District Governor of each District will be responsible to ensure that the MDC Hall of Fame Application Form, candidate's bio and photograph are supplied to the MDC office at least one month prior to the MDC convention.

- 2. A maximum of two (2) candidate per district, may be inducted into the MDC Hall of Fame each year.
- The District office must receive nominations at least 45 days prior to the District's Annual Convention.
- 4. Each individual District will hold an election to determine the successful candidate.
- The award may be presented to either a Lion or Lioness.
- 6. The award may be presented posthumously.
- Each candidate must have 15 years of service and be two years removed from Council (if they have served as a member of the Council of Governors).
- 8. Each candidate should have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavors.
- He/she should be of good moral character and have a good reputation in his/her community.
- 10. All sponsors will use the standard form, no other will be accepted.
- The sponsoring club will ensure the candidate, or representative, will be in attendance at the Multiple District C Convention, as successful candidates will be inducted to the MDC Hall of Fame at the next convention.
- A brief biography and a digital photograph of the inductee shall be sent to the MDC Office, a minimum of 40 days prior to the start of the annual MDC convention, for publication in the MDC newsletter and the Awards Banquet program.

Note: This form/application must be filed with the District Governor and District Awards Chairperson at least 45 days before The District Convention.

District C-1 Citizen Of Distinction –

Submission deadline December 27, 2023

Purpose

To bring recognition to a deserving citizen living within the boundaries of Lions District C-1. The program will also raise the profile of Lions Clubs International.

Who will be recognized?

The Lions District C-1 Citizen of Distinction will be selected from those persons who demonstrate a personal commitment to service. Service shall be broadly defined and may include, but not be limited to, work with youth, seniors, handicapped, the needy, support for global initiatives, or humanitarian service through governments or other agencies. *Lions are ineligible to be considered for this award.*

How will he/she be selected?

- All Lions clubs within District C-1 shall be encouraged to submit a resume of a deserving individual to
 the selection committee (Clubs may wish to conduct a local program within their community).
 Individuals and agencies may submit resumes for those they consider deserving of this prestigious
 recognition.
- Submissions from Lions clubs, individuals, and agencies may be made in memory of someone who is deceased.
- The deadline for submissions to be received is November 25. Submissions shall be valid only for the year in which they have been submitted.

Selection Committee

The *committee* shall be made up of: District C-1 District Governor (chair); a Past International Director; and the District C-1 Awards Chairperson.

What is the recognition

Public recognition of the individual and their cause will be emphasized. A biography will be provided and the recipient will be named a Melvin Jones Fellow. Every effort should be made to have press/TV coverage. If that should not be practical, the District C-1 Public Relations chairperson shall ensure that news outlets are notified.

Funding requirements

Funds to purchase a Melvin Jones Fellowship to come from District C-1 and will be a budgeted item.

Where and When

The presentation will be made annually at the District C-1 Convention.

Dr. Lynn G. Hall Leadership Award for Outstanding Leadership in Lionism – Submission deadline December 27, 2023

This award was established in 1997 in recognition of the outstanding Leadership qualities as were displayed by the late Lion Dr. Lynn G. Hall. Lion Lynn was a member of various clubs for over 50 years and also served as District Governor in 1952-53 and 1975-76. Always quick to step forward no matter what the project, he was a leader by example. He was an active participant in many a fundraiser and a great Lion. Lion Lynn exemplified what Lions is all about; his professional life included teaching, school superintendent, school inspector, provincial director of school administration, as well as serving as Mayor of Lac La Biche and Councilor of Wainwright.

Award Criteria

- 1. A Lions member in good standing with a Lions club for a minimum of 10 years
- 2. A Lion who has demonstrated continuous leadership for a minimum of three (3) years
- 3. A Lion whose leadership may be at the community, club, district or international level or a combination thereof

Application Criteria

- 1. Application may be made by a Lions member in good standing within District C-1.

- 4. Participated in or financially supported Lions Quest Canada
- 5. Participated in or financially supported at least two local youth organizations such as Scouts, Girl Guides, minor hockey, minor ball, minor soccer or other organized and recognized non-profit youth groups
- 6. Provided financial support to the District C-1-and District 306A1 Sri Lanka Foster Child Program
- 7. Made a financial contribution to Camp He Ho Ha
- 8. Made a financial contribution to Camp Tamarack
- 9. Sponsored a new LEO Club in their community
- 10. Provided funds to purchase equipment for children who have special medical needs
- 11. Participated in the Peace Poster Contest
- 12. Participated and/or financially supported Project Pride
