

## **Lions Community Hall opening on 101 Street**

A former downtown appliance shop is now the Lions Club community hall.

Lions volunteers put the new sign on the old CnH Appliance building on 101 Street Monday afternoon. A lot of work now has to be done inside, but when finished it will include a meeting hall for up to 65 people, plus a small kitchen and washroom.

The rear of the building has been leased to the Lions Transportation Society, which operates Fort Saskatchewan's two handicapped mini-buses.

The new hall raises the profile of the club, says local Lions President Derwin Bartlett. "The people in the Fort didn't know where the Lions were."

As well as providing a meeting space for Lions, the hall will also be available to other charity organizations, especially those just starting up and in need of support, Bartlett added.

Local Lions own and operate the downtown wading pool, built Lions Haven senior apartments, the West River's Edge fishing dock, multiple playgrounds and operate the Lions Transportation Society handivans and the campground in Turner Park.

I hope you all had some kind of activity from your club to support the 2023 Diabetes Month, which is/was November. If not, it is never too late. Here are some ideas your club may want to work with or put on your calendar for next year.

- Diabetes awareness coffee: Morning, afternoon or evening coffee/tea with information on diabetes.
- Diabetes luncheon: sell tickets in your communities for a simple lunch, including diabetes information and some form of entertainment. Keep in mind people tend to swarm for food and entertainment.
- Walk or bicycle for diabetes (since exercise is a major factor in managing blood sugar levels) for this you would have to have participants and sponsors - perhaps the school students can help with this.
- Do a bottle drive, or a cantab drive, for diabetes.
- Sit at venues in your community and get donations for diabetes. Blindman Valley Lions did this and used the 'Toonies for Loonies' idea but people did not want their loonies back, so lots of donations. ©
- Fall markets are plentiful this time of year. Club crafts & baking may sell well for Christmas.
- Fall suppers are also very popular. If there are few in your community, this might be a good fundraiser for diabetes.
- Raffle an item and use the proceeds for diabetes research or Camp Jean Neilson (our Diabetes camp in Alberta). Watch for the E-bike raffle Blindman Valley Lions are currently initiating. Great stocking stuffers!

Some of you may have heard the call for donations by Dr. James Shapiro and his team on TV, who are currently, they believe, on the cusp of a cure for diabetes. This is not the first breakthrough for diabetes coming out of this University with Dr Shapiro involved. It was Dr Shapiro, with his clinical team's dedication and hard work that contributed to the Islet transplant procedure (Edmonton Protocol), which then led to full funding and acceptance as 'Standard of Care' for Type 1 Diabetes, by Alberta Health Services, in 2001. Many research teams around the world have been building on and continuing research towards the cure for diabetes. With 11 million Canadians living with diabetes or prediabetes, having Dr. Shapiro and his team right in our own backyard at the U of A in Edmonton is an honour, and should be exciting for us all. Perhaps by Conference time, we will have an update on the progress of this research.

Be mindful of the amount of sugar and glucose-forming foods you eat; aim for 9 servings of vegetables and low-sugar fruit a day, stay mobile (exercise), drink lots of water, and get your rest.

If your club has some idea they may want to share, or have had good success with, perhaps you can connect with me and we can all get in on the fun! We would love to hear what your club did this year, in support of our International Cause 'Diabetes.'

# VISION SCREENING ENDORSED DISTRICT C-1 LIONS PROJECT



Vision Screening has been endorsed as an ongoing District C-1 Lions project throughout the clubs in the district. A Plusoptix vision screening device has been received through a District and Community Impact Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) grant.

The purpose of the Plusoptix vision screening device is to empower Lions Clubs to detect the most prevalent vision disorders in children as early as possible. The earlier a vision disorder is detected the better it can be treated, and possibly prevented. Lions Clubs can conduct vision screening in children aged 6 months to 12 years by holding community events.

The vision screener device is relatively easy to use, and a great opportunity exists for clubs to meet young families in the community. Organizing the training, developing forms and protocols for District C-1 Lions clubs is underway. Once finalized, clubs will be advised and can signup for training.


